APPENDIX E.4. FACILITY ABUSE DEFINITIONS

There are times when the Protective Services for Older Adults definition of "abuse" and a facility's regulatory definition of "abuse" are different. This can create confusion for the reporter as well as the AAA intake person receiving the report. Even if a facility's regulatory definition is different than the Protective Services for Older Adults, when a facility staff person calls the AAA to make a report of abuse the report must be taken. Care must be taken to not frustrate the reporter or tell them that the abuse is "not reportable".

The Protective Services for Older Adults definition of abuse is:

The occurrence of one or more of the following acts:

- (i) The infliction of injury, unreasonable confinement, intimidation or punishment with resulting physical harm, pain or mental anguish.
- (ii) The willful deprivation by a caretaker of goods or services which are necessary to maintain physical or mental health.
- (iii) Sexual harassment, rape or abuse as it is defined in the Protection From Abuse Act (35 P. S. § §10181—10190).

	(v) Involuntary seclusion—Separation of a resident from other residents or from his room or confinement to his room (with/without roommates) against the resident's will, or the will of the resident's legal representative. Emergency or short term monitored separation from other residents will not be considered involuntary seclusion and may be permitted if used for a limited period of time as a therapeutic intervention to reduce agitation until professional staff can develop a plan of care to meet the resident's needs.
