SUBJECT: Area Agency on Aging (AAA) Program Requirements, Planning Allocations and Aging Services Block Grant Format for FY 2012-13

Area Agencies on Aging (AAAs) are advised that the Department of Aging has prepared APD \#13-01-04 Amendment \#1 "2012-13 AGING BLOCK GRANT AMENDMENT \#1: FUNDING ALLOCATIONS". The APD is available to be electronically accessed on the AAAEXCEL drive.

Highlights of the changes for the remainder of FY 2012-13 include:

- Realignment of funding for the State Family Caregiver Program and Health Promotion allocations. The adjustments are based on information provided by the AAA network and waiting list information in SAMS.
- Decreasing the Federal Family Caregiver Program allocation by $\$ 1.5 \mathrm{M}$. This is an adjustment for over extending the allocation in prior years.
- Issuing additional funds for APPRISE Benchmark and Bravo awards as well as the Direct Careworker of the Year.

PURPOSE: The purpose of this Amendment to the Aging Program Directive (APD) 13-$01-01$ is to delineate additional changes to the funding schedule for the FY 2012-13 Aging Services Block Grant Amendment Application and to transmit the FY 2012-13 amended funding allocation levels for each area agency on aging (AAA).

BACKGROUND: This APD Amendment in conjunction with APD \#13-01-01 provides all key information required for the submission of the revision to the FY 2012-13 Aging Block Grant Amendment Application. AAAs are advised to refer to APD \#13-01-01 and this Amendment throughout the process for the development of these plans.

FY 2012-2013
The allocations for the funds included in the Block Grant are segregated to denote Regular Block Grant, Medicaid Assessment (MA), State Family Caregiver Support Program (SFCSP), Federal Family Caregiver Support Program (FFCSP), Nutrition Services Incentive Program (NSIP), APPRISE, Health Promotion, and Other.

## MINIMUM PROGRAM AND FUNDING REQUIREMENTS FOR FY 2012-2013

All requirements established in APD \#13-01-01 continue to apply to this Block Grant Amendment.

## 1. REALIGNMENT OF FUNDS

The Department asked the AAA network to notify the Agency of any underspending and overspending projections for FY 2012-13. Based on the responses of each AAA allocation adjustments were made to redirect anticipated overage funding. Reallocation increases in funding were based on waiting list information reported within the Department's Social Assistance Management System (SAMS). This realignment of funding is only applicable to FY 2012-13. The State Family Caregiver and Health Promotion allocations were affected.

## 2. FEDERAL FAMILY CAREGIVER FUNDS

The available federal funding level for the FFCSP has been reduced by $\$ 1.5$ million dollars. The reduction is a correction for over allocation of available federal funding in the prior fiscal years.

## 3. OTHER CATEGORICAL FUNDS

This Amendment contains applicable changes to the APPRISE Benchmark and Bravo Awards as well as the Direct Care Worker of the Year allocations.

## 4. SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Revised program and fiscal documents of the Block Grant Application are due by close of business on Friday, June 14, 2013. Documents must be transmitted electronically to the Department in accordance with "Procedures for AAAs to Submit Program Reports to the Department". If technical assistance is needed for the electronic transmission of the Block Grant Application, AAAs are instructed to contact the Management Information Systems (MIS) Division of the Department.
